from the Pastor's Desk 21st Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Looking at the week ahead, Friday and Saturday are the feast days of St. Monica and St. Augustine, a mother and son.

For those who are not familiar with their story, St. Monica was an early Christian in the Roman Empire, after the periods of persecution against the Church, whose personal life was a great challenge, but her faith in God sustained her. Her husband, Patricius, was a pagan and a Roman official in North Africa, rumored to be violent, and an adulterer, but someone who held his Christian wife in respect because of her faith. Throughout their marriage, Monica continued to pray for her husband until a year before his death, Patricius was baptized and received into the Church.

Unfortunately, or fortunately depending on the narrative, Patricius did not allow his children to be baptized, although there was a point that he was willing to let Augustine be baptized during a severe illness. It would take a number of years, and a lot of prayers for Augustine to receive the Sacrament of Baptism. After Patricius' death, Monica sent Augustine to Carthage for an education, following which he became a Manichaeon, a combination of pagan beliefs and heresies that the early Church had to stand up against. Through her persistence, prayers, tears and example Augustine finally abandoned Manichaeon beliefs, as well

as a lifestyle that would have been frowned upon by the Church.

In these two saints, we see a great example for today's Catholic families, who struggle with worldly attachments, direction, intellectual confusion and arrogance, as well as the recognition of one's own sinfulness. Like Augustine, many people today feel they could never be worthy of God's love, or that a path to salvation and happiness could be gained by something as easy as accepting Christ's love in our lives. Especially when we become involved with intellectual pursuits, we may decide that there must be something more strenuous, or intellectually challenging that the simple act of accepting Jesus Christ as our Lord and Saviour. One of the greatest aides to the Holy Spirit, in bringing about conversion, is the love of a family member, in the case of St. Augustine, the love of his own mother, whose tears would bring him to Christ.

These feast days come at a great time, as parents prepare their children for a return to the academic year, whether for the first time as preschoolers, or as young adults setting forth in pursuit of higher learning. We should entrust the care of our children to these two saints, to guide and protect them, but also ask them to guide each of us, as we give our children an example of what it means to be a Christian and a Christian family.

Before I close out this column, I want to



mention to everyone that this is Fr. Charles' last week with us at Our Lady of Mt. Carmel, as he is moving to another parish closer to Stony Brook Hospital. For those who may not have realized it, because he has been so generous with his time here in OLMC, Fr. Charles is not actually assigned here, but is a Chaplain for SBU Hospital, and only resident with us. He will be missed, especially by everyone who has grown used to his smile and words of wisdom, but he will not be leaving the diocese, nor his actual assignment. All of us at Our Lady of Mt. Carmel wish him the best in his new residence.

As one friend leaves, another one arrives, and the parish will be happy to hear that Fr. Freddy Lozano is being assigned here by Bishop Barres, to work with the Hispanic population of Brookhaven Town and beyond, in coordination with Bishop Romero. We welcome Fr. Freddy back to OLMC.

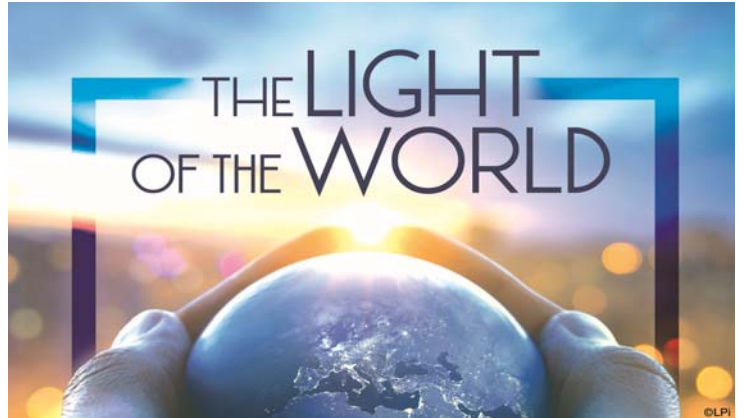
