from the Pastor's Desk 22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Through the grace of God, the storm that threatened to rip through our area did not, and we were spared of what might have been. One of the effects of the storm, or to be more specific, the fear of the storm, was that many people did not come to Mass last weekend, although there was a slightly higher turnout for the 5pm on Saturday than there has been in the last number of weeks.

Over the past couple of years, I have been in conversations with the diocese, and various priests and bishops at the level, about the parish and the future of the local church here in South Brookhaven. One of the things that I was instructed to do, and I was informed other pastors were also informed, was to eliminate one of the Masses. This is something that we did upon our return from the Covid shutdown, as it provided the opportunity. Of course, there are those in the parish who are not happy about the loss of a Mass in English, not only those who regularly attended it, but others who found it convenient, but there was no way to continue to sustain five Masses. Now with Fr. Charles changing his residence, to be closer to his job at Stony Brook Hospital, there would be a greater strain on resources, including myself, if it were not for the return of Fr. Freddy next month.

Because of the dynamic growth of the Spanish Apostolate here at Mt. Carmel, which is not limited to the Mass, but began with the Wednesday night prayer group, the diocese has decided to focus the efforts of revitalizing the Brookhaven Hispanic Apostolate here, at Our Lady of Mt. Carmel. While this may not seem important to non-Spanish speakers, it has made OLMC an important place for the diocese, and gives the parish security. When I arrived here just over four years ago, the main plan from various offices of the diocese was to sell off the property, which would have effectively closed the parish. In more recent times, there was a possibility of leaving the parish church open for one English Mass, which would be celebrated by a priest coming from elsewhere, while the rest of the programs would have been shut down. Because of the Spanish Mass, there are greater numbers in our Mass Census, with more than 50% of the total attendance at the 11:30, and a reason to keep the other Masses in place, rather than losing all or most of the parish.

Because of the changes that have developed over the past four years, we have seen dramatic growth throughout the parish, and even with the drop off in Mass attendance, due to the Corona shutdown and fears felt by many in the community, we are growing. It is an amazing thing to look back and see the developments over the past few years,

and to recognize where it is coming from, not only from those who kept the parish community alive over years of difficulty, but also those who came forward over time. When I arrived, the first group to offer assistance was the Knights of Columbus, and they continue to help out in many different ways. Members of the Ancient Order of Hibernians, the Patchogue Division and my own in Port Jefferson, were here to help get things off the ground, and they still show up when needed. Members of the parish and friends offer to help where and when they can, whether it is financially, with various talents and time, or even those who have nothing to offer but their prayers.

Ultimately, whoever it is that has helped, currently helps, or will help down the road, the true source of all this growth in the parish is God. Looking back, I can see the movement of the Holy Spirit among us; guiding us, strengthening us, and calling more people to live out their vocations as parishioners of this great parish. Thank you all for your continued help in renewing this great parish.

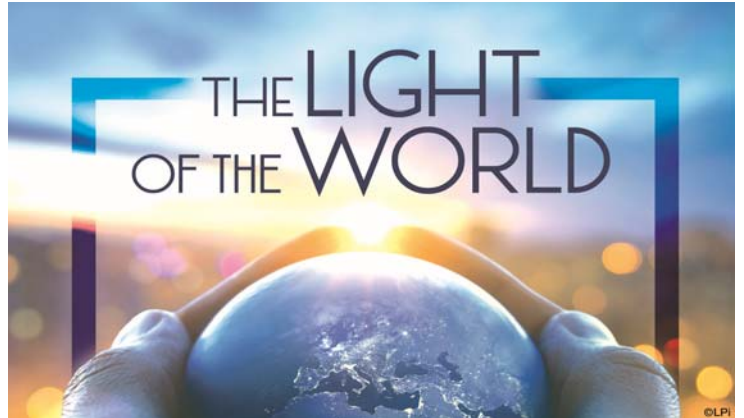
