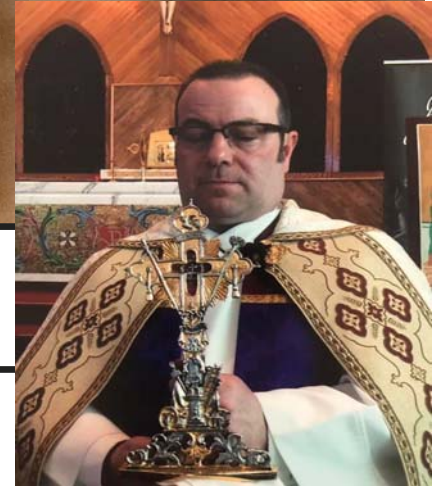

September 5, 2021, from the Pastor's Desk - 23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time



Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Last weekend, I was able to sit down with a friend of mine and talk about the new phase in his and his wife's life together. Telling from Facebook and various conversations, it is something that many people I know are experiencing: Empty Nest Syndrome. Of course, for them it is not a permanent condition, as their younger daughter has only begun her college years, but the rest of the kids are also out of the house finally, so now they have to adjust to life with just the two of them. Fortunately, while they were very good and loving parents, they were also very good and loving spouses, so the adjustment means they can spend more time together. One of the truths in life is that it is always changing.

Here at Our Lady of Mt. Carmel, a number of parishioners have said goodbye to college students in their families, and others have prepared their younger children for elementary or high school, possibly for the first time. The end of the summer and the beginning of the academic year are always bittersweet, as we see the hopes and fears of our children beginning their journeys, and their lives, and the placement of Labor Day to mark the change in our calendars.

Labor Day was never one of my favorite holidays. While I enjoyed the extra day

off, there was that connection with returning to school, and as an adult, the end of the summer season, including the closing of those places I would meet up with my friends. But Labor Day itself honors those men and women who built, and continue to build this nation through manual labor, even those who have to work through it in the service industries. My own upbringing was mixed with education and work (as if they were separate things), academics being for the most part the realm of the school teachers, and the trades and other physical labor being taught by those who hired me and trained me.

My father was my first boss in this respect, as I would often accompany him on days off from school, or other times, first as a gopher, then doing things he taught me along the way. He wasn't the only person I learned from, but he gave me the basics that I needed, in electric, plumbing and construction, but first and foremost in taking pride in one's work. If a job was worth doing, it was worth doing right. Sometimes I wonder if the days of doing a fair days work for a fair days pay aren't over, especially when I hear so many people talk about what they are owed. Recently, a friend of mine was told by the dishwasher that he was stretching out doing the dishes, so he didn't finish too early; the problem was, my friend was his boss, and he had a

few words for him about being paid by the hour.

As I mentioned, my father gave me the fundamentals and made sure I knew what I was doing, and along the way I learned more from other people, both at work and in the classroom, and the best thing he did was let me learn, whether from mistakes or getting it right. Most parents agonize over letting their children go off, make mistakes, or do it right, partly because they are growing up and moving on with their own lives. But if we give them what they need, and by that I do not mean material security, but a sense of who they are and where they come from, a proper moral compass they can look to for direction in the world, and the encouragement to do their best, they are prepared for what lies ahead. Even if there are tears and struggles, that is part of life.

As our children return to school, I also look forward to seeing them in Religious Education next week, where they will receive a foundation of what it means to be a Christian, a member of the Catholic Church, which they can build on throughout their lives.

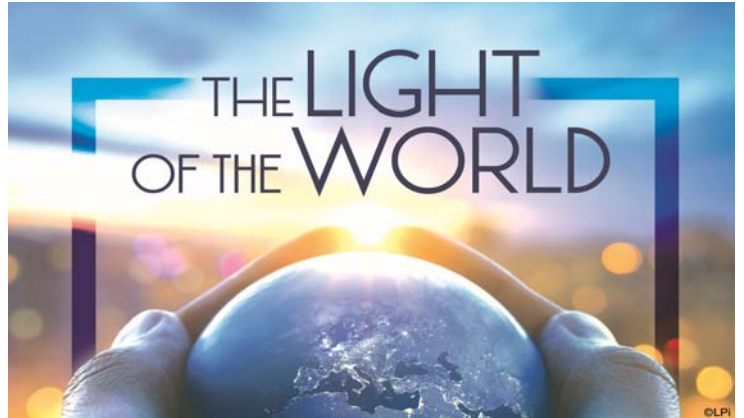
