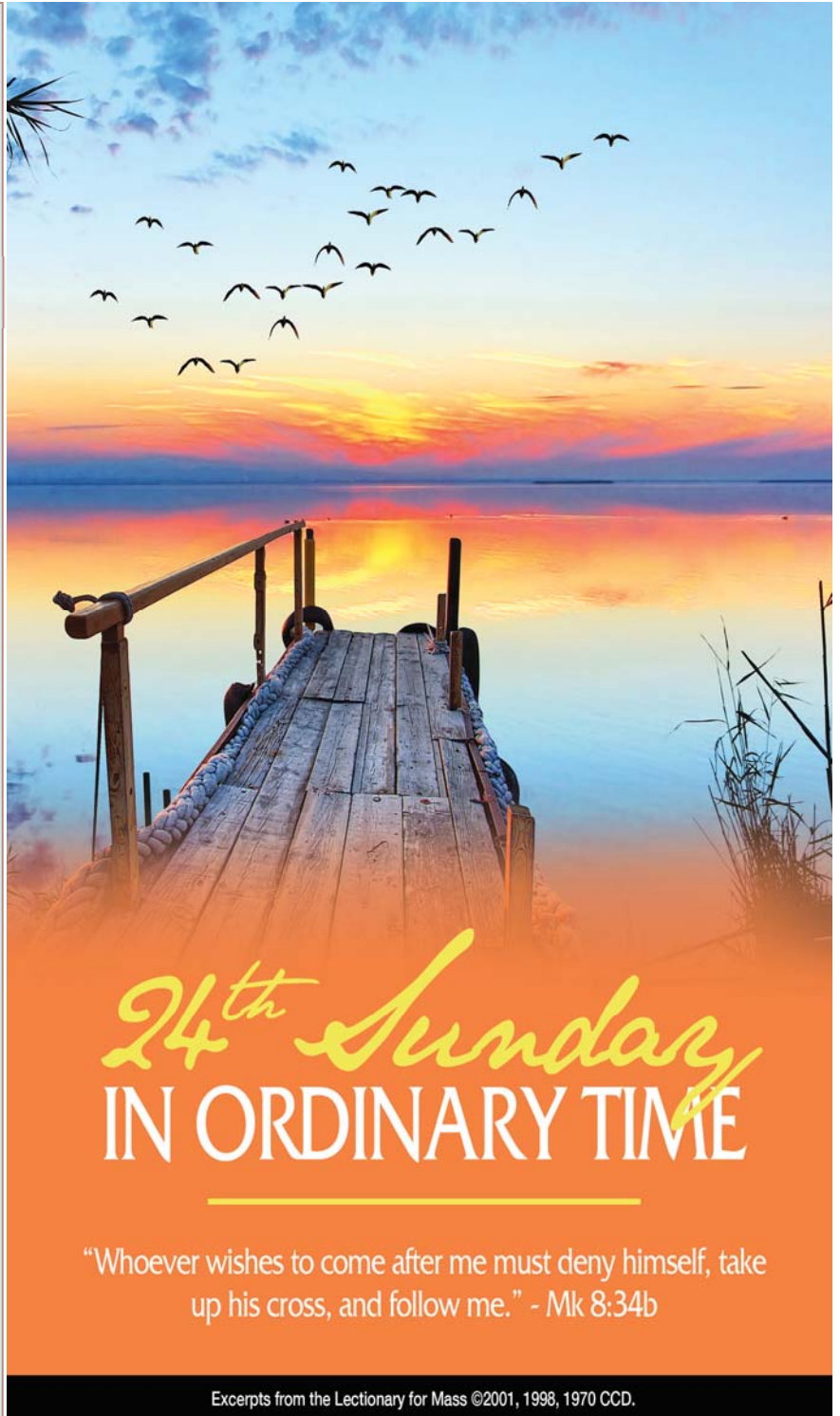

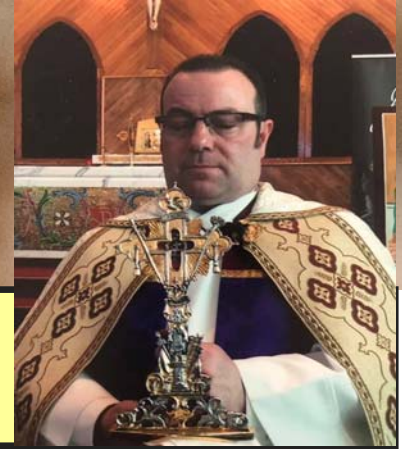

from the Pastor's Desk - 24th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

There are times I notice a changed behavior or perspective in myself, and I have to laugh. The other day, as I was walking through the parish center, I noticed a couple of boxes in the foyer outside the office, and looking at them, I felt relief that they were not addressed to me. Over the past several years, I have been more and more weary of receiving mail or packages, mostly because they are bills or will result in bills.

As a child, my brother and I would look forward to the Sears catalogue arriving at the house (not that we were living in some isolated farmstead in Idaho, the Sears was about a twenty minute drive from our house), because it would contain in it all of the things we could ask from Santa. For those who did not know it, Santa actually produced the toy section of the Sears catalogue, just to make it easier for everyone involved. As I got older, mail became more important to me, and letters were greeted with a sense of anticipation on what they contained. Thirteen weeks on Parris Island, unable to use a phone, letters from friends and family took on an importance that few people can appreciate; it is the reason I write to those I know going through basic training or deployed overseas. Now, most things that arrive in my mailbox are opened only to check for things that would damage the shredder, and few are important enough to make it to my desk.

Looking back, there are some things that have changed, other things my perspective has changed, and some it's a combination of the two.

When I was a child, every Sunday, we would get dressed up: slacks, button down shirt, shoes, to go to Mass. Believe me, this was a big effort, especially since I had to wear a uniform (including tie) Monday through Friday for school, and it was not my favorite thing to do, having to put on something besides jeans and a t-shirt on the weekend. When I became an Altar boy (I'm not being sexist, there were no girls at that point), it was definitely shoes and slacks, and getting up for whatever Mass was assigned (they rotated them then), which was covered over by a cassock and surplice. Later on, the parish switched to albs, and I think everyone started getting a little looser in the way they dressed. In High School, I would attend the Youth Mass on Sunday nights, and the dress code was "whatever". The exceptions I noticed were those of my parents' age and older, who made sure they dressed properly, and those who attended the Spanish Mass (my home parish, Infant Jesus, had the first Spanish Mass in the diocese), and those police officers who came to Mass on their lunch break, still in uniform. This is not to criticize those who come to Mass in what they have; no one should ever be judged by how much money they have or spend on clothing, especially when it comes to Christ.

Unfortunately, by the time I was a junior in High School, my days of going to Mass were at an end... for a while. Those same weeks in Parris Island, waiting for letters, were also weeks I would look forward to Mass on Sunday, partly because they were a break in the intensity of Basic Training and the Drill Instructors. But that is also the time my faith began to reawaken (or awaken), and the beginning of my vocation story.

Another change, one that dates from my days as an Altar boy in cassock and surplice, is the reception of the Eucharist. Serving at the altar, I would extend the patten under the chins of those receiving Holy Communion, in order to catch any possible fragments, and the priest would wipe those fragments into the chalice as he purified the vessels. Just before I became a priest, I heard someone make a dismissive joke about "Jesus Dust" and I cringed. Maybe I didn't fully understand what the Blessed Sacrament was then, but the importance of it was shown in the way it was given, and in the way we received. While letters and packages, the way we dress and the songs we sing may change according to the age or perception, what has never changed is the Reality that the Eucharist is the Real Presence of Jesus Christ, and should be afforded every dignity as such.

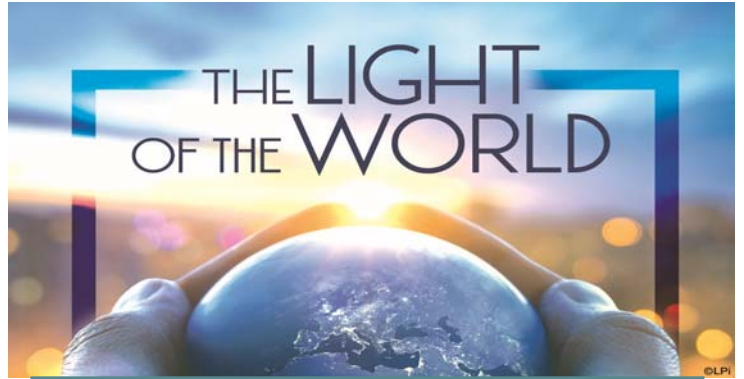
