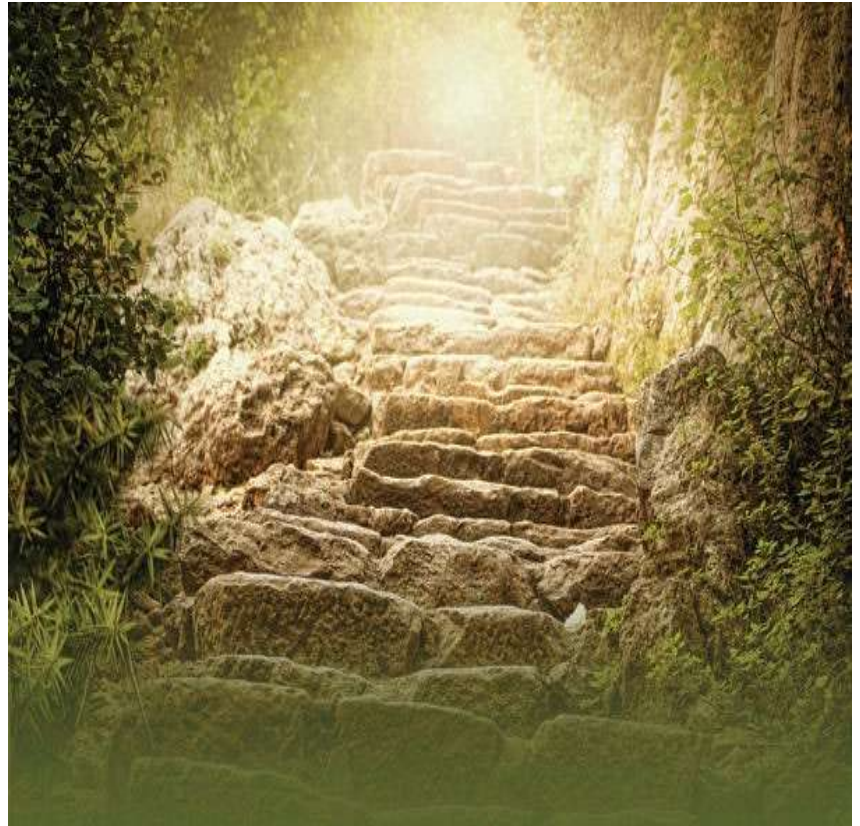

*October 24, 2021 - from the Pastor's Desk -
World Mission Sunday / 30th Sunday in Ordinary Time*

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

This Sunday is World Mission Sunday; while some of you are already thinking "Second Collection", there is more to it.

Each of us is a member of the Church, by right of our baptism, and as such we are part of the Body of Christ. When we refer to ourselves or the Church as Catholic, what we are saying is that it is Universal (which is what Catholic means) and that we recognize our own place in something much larger than each individual person and parish. The Church is found throughout the world, in many different places, celebrating the Sacraments in many different languages, and even though there are slight cultural differences, celebrating the same Mass. What we each consume at the Mass, the Body of Christ, is what we are called to become.

One of the realities that face us, when we profess to believe in Jesus Christ, is that those who share this Baptism are brothers and sisters, those who share the Eucharist are One Body, and as such, we are called to love one another. That is the heart of Charity, which translates as Love. And just as we follow Christ, who was so poor he was buried in another man's tomb, we are also called to see the face of Christ in the Poor.

There are of course things I would like to see done when it comes to missionary work, things that are being fostered by certain Catholic organizations, but not fully embraced by all groups. First and foremost, I would like to see the livelihood projects, those things that are set in place to allow people and communities to support themselves, focus on making people more

independent. For so many years, the objectives of foreign aid from superpowers were to make nations dependent on one or the other superpower, and for the people to be dependent upon governments. In many ways that changed the mindset of people to be less capable of caring for themselves, and looking elsewhere for support and direction. Sometimes that can also be laid at the feet of members of the Church, whether clergy or laity, who saw it as convenient to answer questions rather than educate. That is another aspect of mission work, education. With education people become more self-sufficient and they in turn raise up the living standards of their families and communities.

One of the things many Catholics find surprising, is that the Catholic Church in the United States was considered a Missionary Church until just over 100 years ago, when at the end of WWI it was given its current status. Of course, it was not until the 1960's that the number of American born priests outnumbered those born in other countries, mostly from Ireland, Italy and other European countries. Many parts of the United States are still dependent on missionary style priests, who care for the spiritual needs of spread out communities, visiting parishes once or twice a month for Sunday Mass.

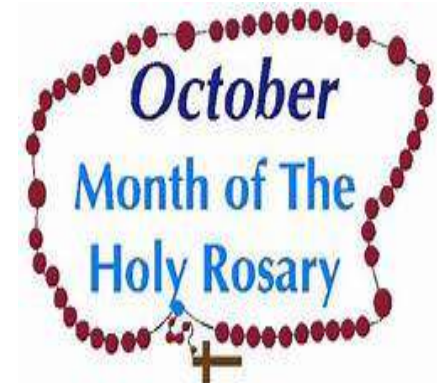
At the heart of our call to missionary zeal should be the love we have for Jesus Christ and the gratitude we feel for everything God has given us, whether the ability to provide for our families or the gift of Eternal Salvation won for us by Christ, as He hung upon the Cross. Whatever it is that motivates us in Christian Charity, it is caught up in our own lives as members of the Church.



There is a story of a missionary who was told by someone they looked to help, "If you have come here to help me, you are wasting your time. But if your salvation is caught up in mine, then welcome." We are all called to be a part of mission, whether it is helping through financial contributions, or reaching out personally, and it is not limited to far away places, but even here in our own neighborhoods, as we seek to bring Christ to our brothers and sisters.
